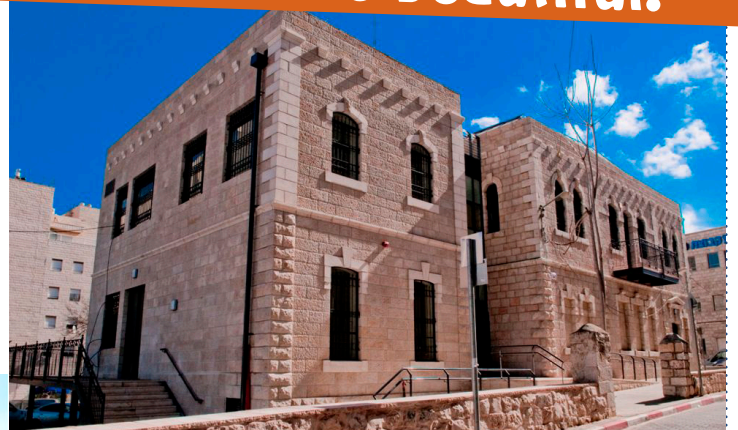


Almost there! It's beautiful!

The 3-day festival, created and produced by TCJ, included performances, panel discussions, family events and Kabalat Shabbat at the Jerusalem Theatre.

Gabriella Lev, TCJ's Artistic Director, comments about the festival and our aspirations in our new home:

"We are very privileged to have the opportunity to create an intimate environment for human interactions around works of artistic excellence. Midrash has always been our way of understanding the world and the human predicament. The tradition of creating and perpetuating midrash was through exchange - a communion with your chevruta, with your community and with your people.
